However, in gripping and haunting plot twist, the once cynical Englishman Carton rises above and beyond; he startles all by taking on a Christ-like role, and convincingly too. The cynic shall save the idealist. With terrifying courage, the Englishman redeems a mispent life, and a sinful nation.

A Tale of Two Cities warns of the darkness of extremism. Only God's forgiveness and grace (Charles Dickens was a devout Protestant) can resolve the sins of mankind; all other paths lead to destruction.
